Message from the Board of Directors & Executive Director

Multiple Births Canada reached a major milestone in 2012-2013 with MBC's application to become a

registered charity accepted. Becoming a registered charity strengthens MBC's mission to improve the quality of life for multiple-birth individuals and their families in Canada. MBC's official charitable objective is to promote the health of twins, triplets and other multiple birth individuals and their families. MBC will work to develop and distribute educational resources and programs for multiple-birth individuals, their families, health providers and health organizations in Canada, and undertake activities incidental and ancillary to the attainment of these purposes.

The Board foresees new opportunities for growth and outreach to families and communities across Canada in the future, as MBC finds new sources of funding. Our deep appreciation goes to lawyers Kevin Fritz and Nick Gray from Wildeboer Dellelce LLP for their incredible contribution to the success of MBC's application, along with the many current and past members of MBC who contributed to this year's successful application.

Another big project this year was developing and launching a **new website for MBC**: the goal was to create a visually appealing, more accessible website with newly updated content. This goal was met through a generous donation from MBC Member Stephen van Esch and his company MessageRocket.

> The issue of parental leave for parents of multiples received a great deal of public debate and media attention from November 2012 to March 2013. First a private member's Bill was introduced in the House of Commons, Bill C-464: Parental Leave for Multiple Births or Multiple Adoptions, proposed by Sana Hassainia, MP. Then Christian Martin's appeal for EI parental leave benefits to both gualified El recipient parents was denied by the Federal Court of Appeal. MBC provided information about the needs of multiple-birth families and spoke to the media a number of times about the issue. MBC is encouraged to see this subject being discussed, researched and debated by the media, and by elected politicians and civil servants.

> Our publicity and outreach efforts received a big boost from a radio Public Service Announcement when Bell Media donated a 30-second advertisement which was played on 15 radio stations.

> The Board and AED developed a **Stakeholder Survey** in spring of 2012 to ask about all aspects of MBC's current resources and support programs, and their wishes for future directions. This valuable feedback helped in the development for our 2013-2016 Strategic Plan.

> We offer heartfelt thanks **to** Multiple Births our Canada's **amazing volunteers**. As an organization run almost completely through the work of volunteers, we know there's truth in the saying that "many hands make light work". Financial Statements

2013 Financial Report (April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2013)

Financial results for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2013 netted an income of \$1,261. In September 2012, the MBC Board hosted the 2012 Retreat and Annual General Meeting. This success of this Retreat contributed to the small profit for 2013. Membership fees continues to be the main source of funding for MBC; however, for the current fiscal year they have decreased due to the change in recording unearned revenue.

MBC continues to struggle to find grants, advertising and fundraising opportunities. MBC was under budget in spending by \$3,564 which also contributed to our small profit for the year. A special thank you to the Acting Executive Director who continues to run a very successful organization on a limited budget.

Extended Parental Leave Project

This past year brought immense national attention to the issue of extended Parental Benefits for multiple-birth families, with MBC being involved in two ways:

- Advocating for Bill C-464: Parental Leave for Multiple Births or Multiple Adoptions, introduced as a private member's Bill by Sana Hassainia, NDP MP for Verchères—Les Patriotes (Québec). Bill C-464 was defeated by a narrow margin at the 2nd Reading on March 27, 2013.
- Supporting Christian Martin, father of twins, as he continued his appeal of the Employment Insurance (EI) decision not to grant parental benefits to both qualified EI recipient parents after the birth of their daughters.

Bill C-464 sought to amend the Canada Labour Code and the Employment Insurance Act to increase the maximum number of weeks during which parental benefits can be paid from 35 weeks to 70 weeks in the case of multiple births or multiple adoptions for qualified EI recipients.



Toward this effort, MBC produced a number of communication pieces in English and French, distributed them to all 308 Members of Parliament, attended both the reading and votes on the Bill in the House of Commons, and met with some MPs in their offices in Ottawa.

Our key messages were:

• The intent of Bill C-464 was to create equality for all parents qualified to apply for the Parental Leave Program (PLP). The PLP was designed to support six key pillars: promote child development; balance demands of work and very young children; make short-term investment for long-term economic gain; use EI as an effective instrument; promote gender equality; and allow businesses to retain valuable, experienced employees.

* Unfortunately, the PLP currently fails multiple-birth families on three pillars: promoting child development, balancing work/ family demands, and providing employment security.

Canada's Employment Insurance Act was previously amended to provide special provisions for Parental Benefits. Fairness for Military Families: Bill C-13 (2010). The intent of Bill C-464 was also justified as it would have provided multiple-birth infants the same quality and level of parental care singletons receive during their formative months.

- * Extended leave for multiple births should reflect the reality that 56.6% of twins and 94.1% of triplets are born at less than 5.5 pounds. Compared to single born babies, multiple birth infants are at greater risk of suffering from long term disability, particularly cerebral palsy and of dying during the first year. Extra weeks allotted by the PLP for multiple-birth parents would allow these parents to provide the additional care and extra time needed to give equal care to multiple-birth infants.
- Extended leave would also address the extreme sleep deprivation issues faced by multiple birth parents when they return to work expected to perform at their previous productivity levels despite their babies' birth age not reflecting their corrected age. This sleep deprivation has been known to affect multiple-birth parents' job security and mental health.
- * And, the PLP should address a related issue many multiple-birth families unexpectedly face when they cannot find affordable daycare or places for more than one infant at a time, therefore being forced to take a leave of absence or quit their job.

In a statement issued on March 27, 2013, MBC expressed its hope that Canada's multiple-birth community will see a positive outcome to this issue in the future.

National Multiple Births Awareness Day

The theme for National Multiple Births Awareness Day 2012 was "Multiple-birth educational resources and peer to peer support - TOGETHER we can make a difference".

As part of the communications plan MBC administered a National Multiple Births Awareness Day 2012 survey. Of the data and remarks collected from the survey, here is a snapshot of what was said about four key programming areas coordinated nationally by Multiple Births Canada and locally by affiliated multiple-birth groups. They are: educational resources, professional outreach, support networks, and peer to peer support.

We asked Canadian multiple-birth parents which MBC Fact Sheets they read or used and found educational and applicable to their lives. Here are the top 5 selected: *Postpartum Depression and Mothers of Multiples, Clothing and Equipment, Expectant Mom Tips, You're Having Multiples* and *Safety Tips for Parents of Multiples*.

We asked multiple-birth families if they had ever provided our professional community with multiples-specific information. Over 60% said they shared multiple-birth educational resources with medical doctors; almost 60% said they shared multiples-specific information with childcare providers, and almost 55% said they shared multiples-specific resources with educators.

We asked multiple-birth families why being involved with a local multiple-birth group and/or MBC is important. The following are two of many similar comments:

- "Without family close by, we knew we'd need as much support as possible when our boys arrived. Now I stay involved as I've connected with a great group of parents, and am proud to be a part of something that makes a difference in my community and serves a real need."
- "Those with twins truly understand how simple things become complicated: feedings, sleeping, potty training. The help I have received from my Facebook support group has gotten me through every bump and hurdle I've faced. A feeling you are not alone or crazy."

We asked respondents if they were planning National Multiple Births Awareness Day activities. Affiliate organizations supported the day in a big way. Across Canada celebrations included:

- Durham Parents of Multiples held a family Picnic at Heydenshore Park

- Multiple Births Families Association of Ottawa/Gatineau had a family day at Andrew Haydon Park
- Multiple Births Guelph Wellington held a family breakfast at Applebees Cambridge
- Saskatoon Parents of Twins and Triplets Organization hosted a pancake breakfast at St. Volodymyr School
- Windsor/Essex POMBA presented a cheque for \$1000 to the NICU of Windsor Regional Hospital

Acting Executive Director Kimberley Weatherall is MBC's sole half-time staff member, and runs the MBC Office from her home in the Ottawa area.

Inquiries

The MBC office receives weekly inquiries from: new and expectant parents of multiples looking for MBC Chapters (calls from areas where no Chapters exist are referred to non-member groups); parents wanting information on clothing sales; those interested in studying or contacting multiple-birth children or parents; professionals seeking more information from MBC to help in their support of multiple-birth families in their communities; media needing multiple-birth information; MBC members and Chapters needing support; and, parents wishing to form a new Chapter.

Website Host and Server

With our change to the website came some needed upgrades to our servers. After some comparison of quotes for pricing and services between our current provider, Message Rocket (owned by Stephen Van Esch) and another independent company from Western Canada, we decided to change over our Internet Service Provider. Based on services, pricing and willingness to work with a Charity on lowered pricing, we decided to move our services to Message Rocket at the end of 2012. With the exception of a short downtime just before the holidays, there was very little disruption and things went surprisingly smoothly. The changeover has drastically decreased our server cost and allowed us greater space availability.



Multiple Births Canada Communications

Website



In early 2012, MBC began work on the design, preparation and launch of a new website, which was released at the 2012 Volunteer Retreat and AGM in September, 2012. The development of this new website was a long process, which still continues to this day.

The redesign of the website began with Stephen Van Esch, a member of Multiple Births Guelph Wellington, offering his services as a Web Designer

in February of 2012. Within a few weeks the project was started, with a target date to launch by September 2012. The goal of the new website was to be welcoming, friendly, professional and easy to navigate.

Over the next 7 months, Stephen worked closely with the Board of Directors and Acting Executive Director, especially with our Director of Information Services, Lori Oldfield, to determine styles, format, fonts, and interfaces that would work for MBC. Once the base was completed, a small committee started to clean up and clarify information on the current site to make sure that only the most accurate and up to date details were moved. By mid-summer we incorporated the assistance of many Volunteers to work on editing the content of the site to be ready for the September launch.

By mid-September the new website was ready, loaded and prepped for the Retreat. To say it was a long week leading up to the Retreat with many late nights and long hours is an understatement, but we had the base site ready to go for the "MBC and You" workshop. That said, it was a basic site that still needed to be worked on and expanded.

Since the Retreat our work has continued on the new website; populating more webpages and setting up logins for the Member and Executive Areas. By the end of the 2013 fiscal year (March 31st) the site was 85 to 90% complete. Today the work continues to ensure the site reaches our goal and is updated regularly.

As we look to the future, we expect continued growth and the need for additional content to be updated and expanded on our site. With the help of volunteers and sponsors we will continue keep our site current and professional.

Social Media

MBC's private Facebook group for members continues to be a valuable forum for members to connect, and to receive news and information. In the past year MBC has developed additional Facebook groups for conference delegates, Chapter executive and



members of some of the Support Networks. MBC also has seen a steady increase in the use of its Facebook "fan page" with membership increasing to over 700 "likes" this past year. MBC's Twitter account has also been used for sharing news and information with the public.

Electronic Tools for Working Together



With the national volunteers, Board of Director and Executive Director working from all areas of the country our use of electronic tools has steadily increased. Over the last year the use of tools such as DropBox, Trello and Constant Contact to share our E-News have been invaluable. These tools were branched out to our Multiple Moments team, Volunteer Coordina-

tors and Health and Education Committee this year with great success; allowing for a much smoother way of communicating and working together. This past year also saw MBC use Constant Contact for the first time as a survey tool when we surveyed families across Canada about the resources and support offered by Multiple Births Canada.

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Support Networks

MBC offers ten National Support Networks to connect multiple-birth choice. A private Facebook group, publications and articles in Multiple families with similar circumstances across Canada.

In the summer of 2012, Lynda Haddon offered to chair a new Preterm Birth parenting journey. Support Network for families whose multiples were born prematurely, The Loss Support Network offers a monthly e-newsletter, Forever Angels, for Intensive Care. Carolyn Leighton-Hilborn assisted and became Chair in the infants or children. A series of Fact Sheets on loss and grief and regular winter of 2012. This growing network offers an email newsletter "Early articles in Multiple Moments offer support to those who are mourning, and Arrivals", a private Facebook group, quarterly articles in *Multiple Moments* parenting after loss.

The Breastfeeding Support Network is MBC's largest support network, connecting members through a monthly e-newsletter, The Milky Way, sharing stories and answering questions about breastfeeding twins or more at one time. A series of 11 Fact Sheets on all aspects of breastfeeding and regular magazine articles keep all MBC members informed.

The Higher Order Multiples Network

responds to inquiries from parents expecting triplets, quadruplets or inquiries and assist the MBC office with translations. quintuplets. MBC offers several publications including the Fact Sheet on the Challenges of Parenting Twins and Higher Order Multiples, and helps to connect families through email, social networking and regular Multiple Moments articles.

The **Special Needs Network** publishes a monthly e-newsletter, All Children are Multiple Moments magazine. Special, discussing topics of concern to parents with one or more multiple-birth children diagnosed with special needs. Personal referrals to resources, several Fact Sheets and articles in Multiple Moments help families find support from "veterans" with similar experiences.

The Lone Parent Support Network offers information and email support to supporting multiple-birth families across Canada. single parents, whether due to divorce, death, military posting, or single by

The Chapter Support Network gives MBC's affiliate Chapter organizations and volunteers a way to connect. Through Facebook networking, workshops at the national Conference, email, and articles in Multiple Moments, the regional multiple-birth organizations exchange advice and best practices in

Health and Education Committee Report

The Health and Education committee has been working on updating a number of older MBC Fact Sheet titles and developing some new ones. It is surprising how long it takes to research the latest statistics and health recommendations, write and edit, review by other MBC volunteers and send to outside expert reviewers, make final revisions, and complete the design layout for publication!

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Partnerships

Assisted Human Reproduction Canada (AHRC)

Our partnership with the Assisted Human Reproduction Canada ended when AHRC closed on September 30th, 2012. Portions of the AHRC have been moved to the Biologics and Genetic Therapies Directorate (BGTD) within the Health Products and Food Branch of Health Canada. This Department will continue to administer and enforce those provisions of the Assisted Human Reproductive Act that remain in force. We are grateful to the AHRC for their commitment to educating families on the risks associated with multiple births, and for their assistance with the creation, promotion and distribution of fact sheets, pamphlets and a multiple-births specific area on the Health Canada website.

International Society for Twin Studies (ISTS)

The International Society for Twin Studies (ISTS) is an international, non-political, non-profit, multidisciplinary scientific organization. Its purpose is to further research and public education in all fields related to twins and twin studies, for the mutual benefit of twins, their families and scientific research. MBC continued to be an active member of this organization thanks to the involvement of MBC volunteer and Acting Executive Director, Kimberley Weatherall (ISTS Board Member to Dec. 2012) and MBC Advisory Board Members Dr. Jon Barrett and Jane Denton (current ISTS Board Members). All three attended the 2nd World Congress on Twin Pregnancy and the 14th Congress of the International Society for Twin Studies in Florence Italy in April, 2012. The next Congress will be held in Budapest, Hungary in April 2014.

International Council of Multiple Birth Organizations (ICOMBO)



The mission of the International Council of Multiple Birth Organizations is to raise awareness of the unique needs of multiple-birth infants, children, adults,

and their families promoting their health, education and welfare.

During the ISTS Congress in Italy the ICOMBO Board met to hold their Business Meeting, organized and chaired by MBC's Acting Executive Director Kimberley Weatherall who stepped into the role of Past Chair during the 2012 Congress. During the Business Meeting



ICOMBO unveiled their new logo, new website and a new membership structure allowing for national multiple-birth organizations to pay their annual fees directly to ICOMBO for the very first time. In addition to presenting on the topic: *Reducing Canada's Reproductive Technology-Related Multiple Births: Canada's Role Through Education*, Kimberley chaired the ICOMBO workshop sessions where organizations and professionals from around the world shared their research, knowledge, programs or projects.

ICOMBO utilizes International Multiple Birth Awareness Week (IMBAW) to draw attention to benchmarks from the Declaration of Rights and Statement of Needs of Twins and Higher Order Multiples and to stimulate international discussion and action on a specific theme. In 2012 we celebrated the following topic: "School placement of multiples, and issues regarding whether separation or not is best". IMBAW is held every two years to coincide with the ISTS Congress year.

ICOMBO increased their social networking in 2012 by creating an open Facebook page for families of multiples from all over the world to share and learn from others facing the same parenting experiences. This site and the closed volunteer site has increased the sharing between multiple-birth organizations world wide.
